ATTENDANCE - ILLNESS


The Chief Medical Officer, Professor Chris Whitty, has issued the following advice for minor illness and school attendance:

It is usually appropriate for parents and carers to send their children to school with mild respiratory illnesses. This would include general cold symptoms: a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. However, children should not be sent to school if they have a temperature of 38°C or above.

Year 7 and 8 Reading Age Assessments

Across the next two weeks, all students in Year 7 and Year 8 will undergo their final reading age assessment of the year (Accelerated Reader "STAR test").

- This will take place during English lessons, supported by their teacher who will instruct students.
- It is an online, multiple-choice assessment, accessed via the Accelerated Reader portal.
- Students do not need to revise or complete additional preparation for this assessment.
- It is adaptive, meaning the questions increase or decrease in difficulty based on student responses.
- For accurate results, students will need to spend approximately twenty minutes or more on this.


Lexi, Y7, attended the Legacy Cheer and Dance National competition in Birmingham with her program, Gymfinity Cheer Team Midnight U12 L2.






Year 10 Business GCSE




Here are some examples of their work on the economy and how the economic climate affects business.





MRS MORGAN-JONES

Students have been working through a topic on understanding external influences on business, where they have been introduced to a range of factors such as technology, legislation and the economy, many of which are outside of the immediate control of the business.



Learning about the economy equips students with valuable knowledge and skills that are relevant in the business world, as well as how it impacts their lives now.



Year 12 Economics

In Year 12 Economics, students have been working in groups, using their creative skills to research and gain a wider knowledge of the UK economy. Students have made posters exploring Portakabin, a UK-based business that specialises in creating bespoke pre-fabricated buildings, often used by schools and healthcare providers. Their posters are both informative and fun...and have made a great display in their classroom!



Year 12 BTEC Business

This year has been full of new information that I have never learnt before. I am someone who did not take business for GCSE and yet have still fully enjoyed the Level 3 BTEC Business course so far.



BTEC Business can be challenging at times but never too difficult to the point where I did not understand what I was doing. It has a good mix of coursework and exams, so you will not become tired of doing either one. The course has four units and at this point (halfway), we have completed 2 units: Exploring Business (coursework) and Developing a Marketing Campaign (Exam).

The First unit, Exploring Business, is about businesses and how they work. One way to explain impacts on a business is through PESTLE, which stands for Political, Economic, Social, Technological, Legal and Environmental. This is used throughout the BTEC Business course. There is also SWOT which is used to analyse a business. It stands for Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats. The second unit is Developing a Marketing Campaign for a given business. This is an exam which lasts 3 hours (that sounds like a lot, but it really isn't). It was really interesting to study a variety of businesses and think about what to focus on in the marketing campaign, planning what it would look like and keeping within a set budget. You will be surprised how much influencers cost!

I believe BTEC Business is a great course even if you did not take GCSE Business as it can be especially useful to have knowledge about how businesses work. I am looking forward to the next two units, one on business finance and one on recruitment. I would personally highly recommend this subject, especially if you are thinking about taking economics as they pair extremely well together as there is a lot of crossovers of information between them.

Employer Talks

Today we welcomed Kirk Hullis to talk to students from Year 8 - 12 on careers in digital marketing. Kirk has worked in marketing for many years now, in both agencies and in-house digital marketing teams, and now works freelance.

Kirk introduced our students to the concept of marketing and how it is done in its more traditional form 'offline marketing'. He then explained how marketing has been transformed with improvements in technology and the introduction of social media meaning that opportunities for digital marketing are vast and Bristol in particular has a huge number of digital marketing agencies. Kirk talked about the many ways that marketing is done online, including through social media/influencer marketing, display ads, search engine optimisation and in app advertising. He also talked about a number of different job roles that are available in digital marketing, some of which benefit from studies in computer science and maths, such as web developers and analysts, but others that rely more on people skills and communication such as account holders.

We have a careers day on Monday 8 July where we would like a range of employers to come in and help with talks or mock interviews for our Year 10 students. Please get in touch if you, or someone you know, would be willing to come in and talk to our students about your career. - Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM) activities






What do we ask parents to contribute?


