PARKING ON CONCORDE DRIVE

Please be considerate when picking up your students from school. We have over 1300 students leaving the site at 3pm and the surrounding roads can become very congested. For the safety of all students and local residents, please do not enter Concorde Drive and arrange a safe place to meet your student a little further away from the school. Please do not park on double yellow lines or over driveways, and please stick to the 20mph speed limit.

NUT FREE SCHOOL

We are a no nut school. Please do not bring any nuts or products containing nuts into school. This includes snacks and lunch items such as pesto.



NEW ATTENDANCE LAW

New attendance law has now come into force. Students are expected to arrive at school at 8.25am, to be in tutor for 8.30am. Those arriving between 8.30am and 9am will be given a late mark and a detention. The new attendance law means that the register will be closed at 9am. Those students arriving after 9am will be given an unauthorised late mark. Repeated unauthorised marks will lead to a penalty notice fine being issued by Bristol City Council.

New attendance law also includes updated penalty notices. A penalty notice can be issued for unauthorised absences once there are a minimum of 10 session (5 days) within a 10-week period. The penalty notice can be issued per parent, per child. The penalty notice is £160 if paid within 28 days. However, this will be reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days.

For a second penalty notice issued within a 3-year rolling period to the same parent in respect of the same child, the penalty notice is £160 if paid within 28 days. There is no option for this second offence to be reduced to the lower rate.

If a penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, then the parent may be prosecuted for failing to secure regular school attendance.

A third penalty notice cannot be issued to the same parent for the same child within a 3-year rolling period. Should the parent continue to incur further unauthorised absences then alternative action will be considered, which could include a prosecution for failing to secure regular school attendance.

Green Jobs are Growing!



You may be aware that the West of England Combined Authority aims to make the region net zero by 2030, 20 years ahead of the UK Government's target. This may require up to 50,000 new green jobs across six priority areas: Nature Recovery, Low Carbon Buildings and Places, Renewable Energy, Climate Resilience, Low Carbon Business and Low Carbon Transport, providing some exciting employment opportunities for young people in the West of England area.
