Students are expected to arrive at school at 8.25am, to be in tutor for 8.30am. Those arriving between 8.30am and 9am will be given a late mark and a **detention**.

HOLIDAYS

New attendance law does not allow schools to authorise family holidays. Please do not book holidays in term time. They are highly disruptive to your child's education.

As a school, we work with Bristol City Council to issue PCN fines and prosecutions to parents who take their children on holiday during term time.

A Penalty Notice can be issued for unauthorised absences once there are a minimum of 10 session (5 days) within a 10week period. The Penalty Notice can be issued per parent, per child. The Penalty Notice amount is £160 if paid within 28 days. However, this will be reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days.

For a second Penalty Notice issued within a 3-year rolling period to the same parent in respect of the same child, the Penalty Notice is £160 if paid within 28 days. There is no option for this second offence to be reduced to the lower rate of £80. If a Penalty Notice remains unpaid after 28 days, then the parent may be prosecuted for failing to secure regular school attendance.

A third Penalty Notice cannot be issued to the same parent for the same child within a 3-year rolling period. Should the parent continue to incur further unauthorised absences then alternative action will be considered, which could include a prosecution for failing to secure regular school attendance.

Please note that parents who repeatedly take unauthorised absences below the threshold of 5 days will also be considered for penalty notices.

Calum can't help feeling that Sergei is hiding something. Or take a look at Terry Pratchett's *Dodger*. With an opening line of 'The rain poured down on London so hard that it seemed that it was dancing spray, every raindrop contending with its fellow for supremacy in the air and waiting to splash down.' it is surely an irresistible read. For Year 12 and 13 students, P.D.James' *A mind to Murder* is a page-turning novel of intrigue. It is common to sometimes feel anxious, however for some adolescents, anxiety can become a significant problem that stops them from doing things; for example, talking to new people, going out with friends, or doing their best in exams.

This webinar focuses on what parents and carers can do to help their young people who are experiencing anxiety. The webinar covers common anxieties during adolescence, such as, exam stress, social anxiety and worries about identity and development. It offers advice on how and when to access support for you and your young person.
