ATTENDANCE PERCENTAGES

As we reach the end of term, now is a great time to check your child's attendance percentage on MCAS. Remember, attendance percentages are not like exam scores: "good" attendance is 96% or above. An attendance record of 90% means that your child has missed the equivalent of one day a fortnight. 90% attendance for a whole year would mean a child missing 18 days, or 108 lessons, severely impacting their education! Attendance records of below 90% are classified as persistent absence and will be discussed with Bristol City Council. Book Review

This Book Kills by Ravena Guron Review by Amelia in Year 7

This Book Kills is a stunning murder mystery book written in the perspective of Jess Choudlary. She retells her experience of the past few weeks in a way that has you on the edge of your seat the entire time! Ask any of my friends - I was physically unable to put the book down. At one point, I was trying to read it whilst walking to lessons!

Like any good murder mystery, it has you convinced that the murderer is someone but then it isn't.
