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Dear Parents, Carers and Students,

## **UK Mathematics Trust Success**

Last term, 88 students from Years 9 and 10 took part in the UKMT Intermediate Maths Challenge.

Many students were very successful in this national competition, with 4 gold, 7 silver and 28 bronze certificates being awarded to BFS students. This is not an easy competition and the students who gained these certificates should be very proud of themselves.

Further to this, four of our students have been invited to take part in the next rounds of this prestigious competition.

Dylan I (Y9) has been invited to the Grey Kangaroo. Harrison L and Roxanne F (Y10) have been invited to the Pink Kangaroo. George A (Y10) has been invited to the Hamilton Olympiad, which is one of the highest levels of this competition and only about 1800 students nationally will be invited to compete.

Pi Day is coming up on **Friday 14 March** (3.14!) and we will be running our annual pi reciting competition. come along at lunchtime on Friday 14 March to take part or cheer on your classmates. It has been exciting to hear so many students reciting the decimal places of pi as they walk the maths corridor.

#### What is pi?

UPCOMING EVENTS

Pi (often represented by the lower-case Greek letter  $\pi$ ), one of the most well-known mathematical constants, is the ratio of a circle's circumference to its diameter. For any circle, the distance around the edge is a little more than three times the distance across. Typing  $\pi$  into a calculator and pressing ENTER will yield the result 3.141592654, not because this value is exact, but because a calculator's display is often limited to 10 digits. Pi is actually an irrational number (a decimal with no end and no repeating pattern) that is most often approximated with the decimal 3.14 or the fraction 22/7.

There was another excellent turn-out for this week's Employer Talk by Tim Spooner from FRP Advisory. Tim explained that corporate finance was about helping people buy and sell businesses. "It's not quite like an estate agent for business," he told students. "But that's the easiest way to describe my role."

Tim studied law at university before qualifying as a chartered accountant and working at 'Big Four' accountancy firm KPMG for 20 years, including five years in London and five years in Sydney. In 2023, he was headhunted to be a partner at FRP Advisory, a smaller boutique firm, with a more specialist focus.

Tim's talk was really clear and practical, and gave students lots of useful tips on how to become an accountant and what it Is like to specialise in corporate finance. He talked about his typical day-to-day activities, which involve advising clients on strategy, winning new work and building relationships with potential new





buyers and sellers. As a partner, his role is more strategic and involves working closely with his team, coaching them and helping them develop their careers.

Some key advice from the talk:

- Accountants need a head for numbers, they do not need to be maths geniuses. They do need to be analytical, strategic and creative.
- People skills and relationship building are important.
- You do not need to do an accountancy degree to become an accountant, but you do need to pass professional exams.
- You can become an accountant through the apprenticeship route.
- Corporate finance is one of the many areas accountants can specialise in.
- Corporate finance is hard work but fun.
- You can work on some exciting deals: Tim once worked on the sale of a premier league football club and his biggest deal was worth A\$1.25bn.

Many thanks to Tim for sparing the time to come and talk to our students, many of whom will have been inspired to look further into a career in accountancy and corporate finance.
