




TERM 1 CHECKLIST





BFS Bristol



BFS is a cashless school. Make sure you have added credit on ParentPay to allow your child to purchase food.

ACHIEVEMENTS



This summer we joined our Year 11 and Year 13 students to celebrate their outstanding GCSE and A Level results.



MRS KING

These results reflect the hard work and commitment of our students and staff, and we are thrilled to celebrate their successes. I am particularly delighted to see that young people from disadvantaged backgrounds have made the most progress in the school's history. It is something we have been focusing on, particularly after the pandemic, so it is wonderful to see this work come through for young people in these results.





GCSE Key Attainment Highlights:

- 80% of students achieved five grade 4s or above, including English and Maths.
- In Double Science, 82% of students achieved grade 4 and above, excluding the 60 students who pursued Triple Science who all achieved a strong pass and above.
- History students excelled, with 24% achieving the top grade of 9.
- In Geography, 51% of students achieved grade 7 and above, reflecting strong academic performance.
- Computer Science saw 89% of students attain grade 4 and above.
- All vocational subjects performed strongly.









A Level Key Attainment Highlights:

- 38% of grades awarded were A or A* (28% national average).
- 83% of grades awarded were A* C (76% national average).
- 48% of students are going on to Russell Group Universities (27% national average).
- 4 students will be attending Oxbridge.
- 6 students will be studying medicine.

What happens at a parent carer nurture group?

- Meet the same parents each week
- Share experiences
- Explore a different theme each session
- Facilitated by a therapist and a community worker (who is also a SEND parent) with extensive experience working with SEND parent carers
- Learn how to relate to difficult emotions with self-compassion, so they can work with us rather than against us
- Nurture activities such as guided relaxations

In terms 5 and 6, Ms He and Mrs Szucs ran Lego Therapy Club. This intervention aims to provide opportunities to develop important social skills: shared attention, collaboration, listening, communication, problem solving, compromise, turntaking, sharing.
