Dear Parents, Carers and Students,

The House system was introduced across the year groups in 2020 to create a vertical community for students. Within these communities, students build relationships, support each other, engage in friendly competition, and work together to make positive contributions within their House, School, and local community.

The Houses are named after local parks within Bristol. All students belong to a House, which they will represent at BFS. Students can stand for election as a House Leader or for House Parliament, allowing them the opportunity to take on responsibility and develop their leadership skills. Furthermore, all teaching staff are allocated a House to foster healthy competition throughout the School.

The structure of the House system means that each student has a chance to shine, to discover their own talents and to make a genuine contribution to the School community. House assemblies, events and celebrations allow relationships to be fostered and built, not only within, but also across differing year groups and even into our Sixth Form. There are inter-House competitions in numerous academic, sporting and cultural activities including music, poetry, maths and English, science, general knowledge, drama and art. The varying nature of the competitions allow students to come together and meet others they may not otherwise encounter. The Houses also fundraise for local causes, providing students with a wider sense of perspective as to the role the School plays within its community.

At BFS we pride ourselves on acknowledging and rewarding the wonderful contributions students make to school life. We split our House points into three categories which are linked to our core values of Community, Ambition and Opportunity. Students can earn House points through:

Community - awarded for excellence within tutor period and any other pastoral area of the School.

Ambition - awarded for academic contribution within lessons and for homework. **Opportunity** - awarded for participating in our wonderful extra-curricular opportunities, after school clubs, performances or sports teams.

Each week, in the Newsletter, we celebrate the students who have earned the most House points, as well as those who have entered House competitions. We look forward to seeing if Blaise can hold on to their title this year!

Lunch Money

Please regularly check the balance of your child's lunch money account via ParentPay to ensure they have sufficient funds to purchase food.

Please be reminded that Yondr pouches are part of your child's essential equipment, and that it is their responsibility to ensure they have it at school with them each day. Students are not allowed to personalise or decorate their pouches and lost or deliberately damaged pouches must be replaced at your own cost.







Exit from school











- Pouches distributed at start of each term
- Collected at the end
- Pouches unlocked at gate with fixed magnetic locks
- Phone switched off
- Phone placed inside
- Pouches locked
- Students show locked pouch
- At the start of tutor time students are asked to place pouches on desk
- Tutor completes visual check of locking
- Random checks in tutor
- Classes / groups are selected
- Pastoral and senior staff use portable lock
- Checks are made for phones being inside, switched off etc.
- Pouches unlocked at gate with fixed magnetic locks
- · Phone taken out
- Switched back on
- Pouches locked to prevent damage
- Students take both pouch and phone home

Penalty Notices and Prosecution

At BFS, we work with Bristol City Council to fine parents/carers of students with unauthorised absences.

Unauthorised absences are issued for:

- Arrival after the register closes at 9am without good reason
- Unauthorised holidays and other events not authorised by the Headteacher
- Absences where no reason has been supplied by the parent/carer
- Absences where medical evidence has been requested by the school and not received

Penalty notice fines are normally issued for ten unauthorised sessions (each day being two sessions) of absence in a ten-week period. Penalty notices can also be issued to parents who repeatedly take absence below this threshold. Prosecutions can also be issued if more appropriate than a penalty fine.

Currently, the costs of penalty notices are:

- £80 per parent/carer per child for the first offence in a rolling three-year period, rising to £160 if not paid within 28 days
- £160 per parent/carer per child for the second offence in a rolling three-year period
- If a third offence occurs in a rolling three-year period, alternative action such as prosecution will result. Prosecution can result in fines of up to £2,500 and/or 3 months imprisonment, as well as a criminal record.

At BFS we prefer to take a supportive approach to attendance before taking these legal measures, so please contact the attendance office if you are concerned by your child's attendance.







Katy in Year 11 won first prize for her Victoria sponge and her brownies. She was also awarded the WoT Society Challenge Cup for the most points in the baking category.





Term 1 Extra-Curricular Activities



In January 2026, Bristol will take part in the Bristol Youth Elections to vote in young people to the Bristol City Youth Council for a two-year term of office. The Youth Council will represent the young people of Bristol and campaign on issues that are important to the young people of Bristol.

The main aim of a young person on the Bristol City Youth Council is to represent the views of young people. You would need to commit around 2 - 3 hours a week over the two-year term of office. This is outside of school hours and can be flexible during exam times.

How to stand as a candidate:

You can stand for election if you are under the age of 18 on the day of the election (13 February 2026). Applications open 1-31 October 2025.

- 1. Complete the 'Contact Details and Parental Consent form'
- 2. Complete the Nomination form
- 3. Attend a candidate workshop (dates, times are below)
- 4. Make a 1-minute (maximum) video clip, telling voters why you want to be a member of the Bristol City Youth Council and why they should vote for you
- 5. Send all your information to the Participation Team by post or email
