## EVERY DAY COUNTS

As Term 2 ends, please check your child's attendance on the MCAS app. Remember that good attendance is 96% and above.

90% attendance equates to 18 missed days and 108 missed lessons as well as clubs, trips, events and social time with friends. Remember: Miss School, Miss Out!

Recent DfE research has shown that persistently absent pupils in secondary school could earn £10,000 less at age 28 compared to pupils with near-perfect attendance, and that for each additional day of absence between Years 7 to 11, the typical pupil could miss out on an average of £750 in future lifetime earnings.

The research has also shown that Year 11 pupils with near-perfect attendance are almost twice as likely to achieve grade 5 in English and Maths GCSE, compared to similar pupils attending 90-95% of the time. In other words, missing just 10 extra days a year reduces the likelihood of achieving these grades by around 50%!






# YEAR 9

## *Amari and the Night Brothers* by B.B Alston





**Work Experience Employer Talks Careers Day**



## EMPLOYERS TALK

On Friday 12 December, we welcomed Beth Philips, Practice Tutor Assessor and Registered Probation Officer, to our Employer Talk. Beth spoke to students about a career as a Probation Officer within HM Prison and Probation Service. She explained that the core probation values are Purpose, Openness, Humanity, and Togetherness.



Beth described the role of a probation officer and what her day-to-day work involves. A probation officer plays a crucial role in the criminal justice system by supervising individuals who have been released from prison on probation or sentenced to community-based orders instead of incarceration. Their primary responsibility is to ensure that offenders comply with court conditions, which may include attending rehabilitation programs, avoiding criminal activity, and maintaining regular contact.

Probation officers act as a bridge between the offender and society, supporting reintegration while safeguarding public safety. They conduct risk assessments to determine the likelihood of reoffending and create tailored supervision plans. This often involves monitoring behaviour, conducting home visits, and liaising with other agencies such as social services, mental health professionals, and law enforcement.

In addition to enforcement, probation officers provide guidance and support to help individuals address underlying issues such as substance misuse, unemployment, or housing instability.

Beth then explained the qualifications required to become a probation officer. She explained that there are different roles within the Probation Service, such as administration or Probation Service Officer. Both roles offer the opportunity to gain a Level 3 qualification (equivalent to A Levels), which can lead to applying for a Trainee Probation Officer position.

You can also apply after completing a relevant degree, such as criminology. If your degree is in an unrelated subject, you can still join and study alongside working to build the necessary knowledge base. During this time, you would be known as a PQiP (Professional Qualification in Probation). Once qualified, you would hold a Level 5 vocational qualification. An apprenticeship route will also be available soon.

Students also learned about salary scales within the Probation Service, where the highest level - Band 5 (Manager Grade) - currently offers earnings between £44,100 and £46,000.
