# Words from the Headteacher

This term has flown by with the October holiday upon us once again. With a whole new year group and a large number of new staff (we've almost doubled in size) joining us in our new buildings this year, the settling in process has been pretty smooth. Teaching staff and students are in the process of setting targets for Term 2 and we are keeping focused on differentiation and feedback; challenging students of all abilities and needs to make excellent progress together with providing effective feedback through comment marking and ensuring that the students respond to their teachers' comments.

Tuesday 5 November is our Academic Monitoring afternoon where parents, carers and students meet with tutors, discuss how the first term has been and set targets for the next term's work. As a consequence no after school clubs will run on Tuesday but students who have early appointments are able to stay on and continue with homework or private study in the Learning Resource Centre (LRC). Clubs and activities will take place on the other days of the week as usual.
