Words from the Headteacher

I am pleased to report that having reached the penultimate week of term we have completed our recruitment of additional teaching staff for September 2014. The calibre of teachers applying for posts at Bristol Free School is as high as ever and with over 250 applications for nine new positions, we were spoilt for choice. Together with a substantial number of internal appointments we have established a teaching staff structure which will serve the School well as we grow to full capacity and in anticipation of our sixth form opening in September 2016.

During the summer term we will be recruiting additional support staff to complement our teaching staff structure and these posts will be advertised on our website via Eteach. We welcome applications from parents and people in our community and I look forward to receiving your application if you would like to come and work with us at Bristol Free School, helping to educate our students and develop the School further.

While we were able to remain open to all students during yesterday's industrial action, about a quarter of lessons were affected. The students responded very positively and helped us manage what was an unusual day. With the teaching unions currently engaged with the government in talks, I hope for a speedy resolution to the issues.

The amount of found property 'lost' by our students is growing. We will be attempting to reunite the found items with their owners before Easter but once Friday 4 April arrives any unclaimed property will either be kept for school use or handed over to charity stores. Found property will be available for collection between 3.00pm and 3.30pm every day next week. Please remind your child to collect any missing items before Friday.

Academic monitoring afternoon is the first Wednesday back after the Easter break, 23 April. Students are making appointments with their tutors so that you may attend. The purpose of this meeting is to take stock of the progress made by our students and look at specific areas in which they can make improvements and renew their efforts. I will also be asking parents to complete a questionnaire about Bristol Free School during the afternoon. This questionnaire provides me with vital information about how we are doing and what we need to do keep the School moving forward. I look forward to your contribution to helping Bristol Free School 'rise to the challenge'.
