


#### Words from the Headteacher

Letters were sent out earlier this week via students informing parents of our parent governor election. We have two vacancies, to begin from 1 September 2015 and the term of office for both positions is four years. Being a school governor is a key role in any school and is vitally important to Bristol Free School. If you become a governor you will join one of the largest volunteer forces in the country and have an important part to play in raising school standards. The role of our local governing body is absolutely key to the effectiveness of the School. Time and time again Ofsted (the national inspection body for schools) has noted that the most effective schools demonstrate effective leadership and management - including by the governing body. Our Ofsted inspection reports that, "Outstanding leadership has driven the school's early achievements. Such is their passion for the success of the school that governors, including the parent representatives, are exceptionally well informed and involved in key decisions." The role of the governing body is a strategic one with its key functions being to:

- set the aims and objectives for the School
- set the policies for achieving those aims and objectives
- set the targets for achieving those aims and objectives
- monitor and evaluate the progress the School is making towards achievement of its aims and objectives
- be a source of challenge and support to the Headteacher (a critical friend)

The School has benefitted hugely from the support of our current parent governors and I cannot thank them enough for helping shape our school.
