## Words from the Headteacher

A reminder to all parents and students that term starts on Tuesday 2 June as Monday 1 June is an Inset day. One of the sessions for staff on the Monday Inset is training on our new homework system called "Show My Homework". You may have noticed that a link for this has appeared on the front page of the website. From Tuesday 2 June staff will use this system to set homework. Near the beginning of term your child will bring home a letter with details about how to login in to the system. Included in the letter are instructions showing how parents can login. I am entrusting the students with the responsibility to deliver this letter to you. Nevertheless, when we send the letter out you will receive a text message telling you that it is coming home with your child. If, for any reason, the letter fails to make it home just let us know and we will ensure that you receive your login details. Show My Homework's website is very user-friendly and at the bottom of the homepage is a link called "Helpcentre", where you will find straightforward guides to help you navigate and understand the system. The system can be used on a number of devices which have access to the internet; however, if you or your child are unable to access the internet on a regular basis then we have access in school for students and Westbury on Trym's library offers free internet access. On that note, Westbury's library is under threat of closure and locals have organised a petition to keep it open, please sign up to the petition. Libraries are not just vital resources within a community but physical symbols of a society's commitment to learning and wisdom for people of all ages and all walks of life.
