Words from the Headteacher

It is always lovely to welcome students back after the Christmas holidays. They seem rested and there is a sense of warmth engendered by the festive season. I make a point of asking what Santa has bought this year; the replies seemed to share certain commonalities: clothes, vouchers, two wheeled transport. I was also pleased that Santa saw fit to put into his bag of goodies some new school shoes and blazers, but also disappointed that the magical 'self-tucking in shirt' did not make into some of our students' stockings. The best answer to my question came from one of our Year 11s; "Santa bought me happiness, Sir".

On the topic of year 11, the gift of happiness is a valuable commodity in the weeks ahead. There will be some pressures, undoubtedly, with the feeling that time is marching on and that there are only 15 weeks until the first GCSE exam of the season. The Mock results were promising and students will get these formally on Monday. It shows what students can and cannot do. We spent our inset day focusing on exactly how best to support each student in the run up to the exams. There are certain truisms:

- We cannot help students who are not in school: attendance and punctuality is vital; teenage lethargy is the enemy of progress!
- We cannot help students who do not revise. There was a clear gap between those who put in the hard yards and those who did not in the run up to the mocks. The key is little and often: revision should be happening right now, every single day.
- 3. Revise the things you don't know and struggle with!

Further updates will follow, including our exam mentoring programme and our updated Period 7. As a rule of thumb, nearly all students are doing English on Mondays until 4.30pm. The only additional support I would request from parents is that you do everything in your power to ensure that students have no distractions and in particular that they are able to stay after school to study and revise. It's a classic case of small sacrifice, big reward. This may mean making alternative arrangements to support younger siblings for example, who might currently be collected from school by a brother or sister.

It has come to the attention of the local authority that anonymous Instagram accounts are being set up by third parties as a means of sharing photos as a form of revenge pornography. The accounts are being run by users sharing their photos via private message or by tagging the site and then the anonymous account publishes the photos. These accounts are not staying open for long as they are being reported but the accounts appear to all be variations of the name 'Bristol Bait'. There appear to be links to many secondary schools in our area. If you become aware of any such account please contact the police immediately.

Extra-Curricular—new clubs!

A new extra-curricular programme begins next Monday and sees with it the launch of the brand new Classics Club for years 7 and 8. We are very excited about this new opportunity for students to learn more about this study of the languages, culture, history and thought of the civilisations of ancient Greece and Rome. In Classics club, students will embark on a journey through the worlds of ancient Rome and Greece, and will explore the influence of classical culture on our own modern world. They will also have the opportunity to learn some Latin – a language from which 65% of English words and about 75-80% of French, Spanish, Italian and Portuguese words are derived.

During the club we will be looking at some famous Greek and Roman myths, exploring some epic adventures stories like 'The Odyssey' and 'The Aeneid', and finding out what life would have been like for Romans, not only in Rome, but also closer to home in Bristol and Bath. There will be opportunities to act out plays, create shields, build temples out of biscuits and debate philosophical issues, to name but a few of the exciting activities on offer.
