Classics Club

Classics at Bristol Free School is going from strength to strength. Around 20 students in Years 7 and 8 attend Classics Club each week. The club positions the learning of Latin within the broader study of various cultural and historical elements of the Ancient World. So far this term, we have used drama and art to explore famous Greek myths such as the stories of Daedalus and Icarus (noli volare prope solem!) and King Midas (vertere omnia ad aurum volo!) and are now learning about life in 1st century AD Pompeii through the eyes of Caecilius and his family. New students are always welcome to join the club which runs after school on Mondays (Please note that there will be no club on



Monday 20 March but we will be back to normal on from 27 March).

The two GCSE groups are also working very hard. Year 11 should be commended for their dedication in studying for an extra GCSE after school, while Year 9 students who have embarked on the GCSE course a year early should be proud of how much they have achieved so far!

Last week, Miss di Martino and 3 teachers from Westbury-on-Trym CofE Academy attended a fantastic training day about how the Minimus Latin course can be used at Key Stages 2 and 3. As a result, Westbury will be launching a Minimus Latin club in the summer term and there are plans to expand the provision of Latin at KS3 here at Bristol Free School from September.
