Before half term our Year 12 Cambridge scholars took part in their second session on developing a research article of their choice. They shared it with other potential Cambridge applicants from across the city, with their final pieces being showcased at Bristol Cathedral later in the year. Our Maths Ninjas have been mentoring Year 7 students and our English mentors have been spending tutor times each week helping Year 11 prepare for their mock exams.

### **History Trip to Munich**

A very cold and early start on 8 February saw the Year 11 historians head to Heathrow to embark on their trip to see some of the key places in the history of Nazi Germany. We arrived in time for lunch and then explored a snow covered Munich, including stopping at the Odeonsplatz (left), on foot with the expert guidance of Janet our tour guide.

Friday was a humbling day that will stay with our students for a long time; we visited Dachau concentration camp. Visiting in the snow certainly added an extra sense to the visit; we were cold in our thermals and multiple layers; working in those conditions in striped pajamas is a not a thought that is easy to digest. Thankfully we were able to end the day on a lighter note with a game of bowling.

Saturday saw a trip to Nuremberg; the site of the Nazi party rally grounds, and later the location of the trials. In the evening we visited the Olympic Park including a trip up the 291m tall tower, and managed to successfully navigate the trams and tubes (an achievement that required a few attempts, it must be said—ask Alayah, Levi and Sam...). By Sunday, it was time to come home, via Neuschwanstein Castle; the site of the most epic cross-valley snowball fight BFS students have ever seen.

The students were a credit to themselves and the school; it was a fantastic start to the half term.


