This week in Year 11 Maths...

Year 11 have made a fantastic start to the academic year. The new structure of parallel groups is proving very successful, raising aspirations for all. A small number of students have been receiving extra targeted support at tutor time and in Period 7 sessions, and students are responding really well. Later in the year this will become available to more students, but the key message to everyone is that if students work hard in lessons, do the homework on time - including the revision assignments on the <u>Mathswatch website</u> - and revise properly as guided by their teacher, then this will be enough for students to reach or exceed their target grade. The Mathswatch revision programme is a coordinated 6 week revision schedule following the little and often model of revision.

The Year 11s have a term 1 class test on Monday. This is only on the topics from term 1 and will be done in lessons. The much bigger goal on the horizon is the Mock Exams at the end of November. Maths papers are 27 November, 30 November and 5 December. If you can remind and support students in having and bringing correct equipment - including a calculator and a maths set - this will help with the smooth running of all the exams.


