The Bristol Schools' Swimming Gala according to James L, Max and Erin

The team came 2nd in the medley relay. "Theo kicked off the backstroke. We were in last place by the end of the first 50m. James H dived in for breast stroke, closed the gap and got us to 3rd. James L dived in for 50m fly and brought the team into 1st place. Max on freestyle finished the race in 2nd, very closely beaten by King Edward School, Bath."

Erin placed 1st in 50m freestyle. "I was focusing on beating a friend of mine from BGS who was in lane 3. I was in lane 4. I was feeling calm before the race started. The block was damaged and I had to adjust my dive because of this. She turned to do the second length before me, so I knew that I had to swim as fast as I could to try to catch her. I passed her just before the final set of flags and went on to win the race. I was very tired after this race. I was feeling very happy at the result".

Max placed 5th in breaststroke 50m. "I was in lane 1. I had a swimmer from Cathedral in my sights as I swam my first length. Out of my dive I was in 3rd place. My turn didn't go to plan which slowed me down and left me in 5th place. I maintained my position of 5th for the second length ensuring the other three swimmers didn't pass me".

James H placed 1st in 50m breaststroke (the same race as Max). He was one of the favourites to win the race and he delivered.

James L placed 2nd in 50m backstroke. "Backstroke isn't my strongest stroke so I was a bit worried that I wouldn't do well. I was getting some tips from a Y10 from Cathedral on how to swim my race the best way – which really helped me to get my result. My backstroke start was strong despite the slight slip of my feet on the wall. I worked on my rotation and it came to the dreaded turn. I was currently coming second (I think – but I couldn't see as I was on my back). The turn did not go well – I did not do my underwater phase after my turn well. Post turn, I was very near the back of the race. I managed to pick myself up, swim as fast as possible and finish in second place".

A huge well done to all the swimmers for their fantastic efforts over the last few weeks—we are very proud of you all! - Mrs Wynne-Jones
