Rugby success!

On Thursday 6 December, the Year 10 boys played Ashton Park in the final of the Bristol Schools' Rugby Cup. They played at Lockleaze Sports Centre on a very wet and muddy afternoon. Ashton Park were boasting 13 club players, including 4 Bristol development players. However despite this, we started the stronger of the 2 teams.

The first try came in the opening 4 minutes when Theo crashed over the whitewash. Bailey then successfully kicked an important conversion to give us a 7-point

On Thursday 13 December, the Year 9 boys travelled back to Lockleaze to play Ashton Park school again. We made a bright start with James scoring an early try. We put together some really good rugby and attacked with flair and precision. Tom was elusive in his running, finishing with a hattrick of tries.

Ashton Park continually kicked the ball to Harvey at full-back who punished them with his direct and probing runs, helping, along with Caleb, to unlock our powerful back line. Joel, Andrew and Jayden benefitted from the accurate distribution from the back, and the forwards also contributed, with heavy, robust running. Oscar and Luke crashed over the line for a brace of tries. Harvey kicked 8 of the 10 conversions on offer to complete a comprehensive 71-0 win, crowning BFS the Bristol Schools' Rugby Champions again!

If a student is unable to collect in person, they may nominate someone to collect on their behalf. They must write a letter authorising the nominated person and this must be signed and dated. The nominated person must bring photo ID with the letter.

Please keep your certificates in a safe place, as the exam boards charge up to £50 to replace each one and some awarding bodies do not offer a replacement certificate service.

Any certificates not collected after 12 months will be destroyed in accordance with JCQ guidelines.
