

First up was a revision-busting workshop which gave them direct feedback from the examiners as to how best to approach each type of question. They were then treated to a theatrical treat in the form of 'a light-hearted look at the history of medicine through time', where each character was brought to life by actors. The 'explosion' re-creating the bombing in WW2 certainly added to the experience.

Following a well-earned lunch break, further revision and exam technique ensued, only this time the focus being Paper 3; Weimar and Nazi Germany. It was a real pleasure to see the students working hard and accurately grading exam papers. Up next, we saw that most infamous of leaders, Adolf Hitler, face trial for crimes against world peace. This was in the format of a court-room scene with actors portraying key characters in both Weimar and Nazi Germany.

BFS overwhelmingly voted that Hitler was most certainly guilty of crimes against world peace, but as we waited for Hitler to be taken to prison, he was shot dead right in front of us!

'Historically', the trip has been of great value to our Year 11s and I am confident that the students who attended yesterday will feel the same.

Changes to the A4018

Bristol City Council is proposing changes to improve the A4018. One of their aims is to invest in public transport to keep the road flowing to support local residents, businesses and tackle the increase in demand on the road due to housing development on the former Filton Airfield site. The other aim is to improve safety for pedestrians and cyclists, particularly for students attending schools in the local area.

The consultation will be going live next Monday, where local residents and organisations are invited to comment on the proposals.
