After lunch it was on to the most difficult of the tasks. Emily and Pippa were trusted to use the most advanced equipment in the lab to identify their samples with Anna and Ollie doing further analysis. They were marked on their accuracy and skill as well as safety and efficiency, with one esteemed judge commenting to Miss Board that they were certainly the most enthusiastic team!

The excitement carried on throughout the afternoon as we watched a dynamic chemistry demonstration from the incomparable Tim Harrison, who not only took a shower in liquid nitrogen, but sent a river of it flowing under our feet!

Last weekend there were 6 BFS students who took part in the Ten Tors Challenge in Dartmoor. Ten Tors is an army run event where teenagers from 14-19 years old walk from 35 – 55 miles over two days. All competitors had to complete 6 months of training that started with day hikes and then progressed to whole weekend hikes. Overall competitors had from 7am on Saturday until 5pm on Sunday to finish. My team completed the 35mile walk by 1.30pm on the Sunday. Art update


