As mentioned last term, our Meet the Employer talks have started at BFS. Before Christmas, we welcomed Airbus to give a talk to our KS3 students about the exciting array of careers available with them. It was brilliant to see so many of our younger students (79 in total!) attend the talk and ask some excellent questions on topics such as the production methods of military aircrafts, whether Airbus are developing an environmentally-friendly strategy and whether there will be more jobs in space travel! Airbus also came in and spoke to our KS4 and KS5 students, which was equally well attended.

## Online Software Access

Students can log on to the Microsoft Office 365 website ([www.office.com](http://www.office.com)) using school credentials and access web versions of Microsoft Office products. Files can then be stored on the OneDrive and accessed in school. Students already have access to Google products (Docs, Slides, Sheets) which can be accessed the same way as accessing Google Classrooms - sign in to Chrome - click the 9 dots and select Drive or the file type.
