In times of conflict and emergency, there are always people trying to help and protect others.


When we mark Remembrance we remember and give thanks for the people who help and protect others now, or who have done in the past. We remember those who have been hurt or killed as a result.


Remembrance is hope for a peaceful future.

required.





BFS WINS AWARD FOR YOUNG CARER SUPPORT

Bristol Free School has been awarded a Bronze Young Carers in School Award from The Young Carers in Schools programme to celebrate the work we do to support our young carers. Young carers take on huge responsibilities looking after someone at home and can be responsible for emotional, practical or physical care for a parent, sibling or other family member who has a physical disability, mental health issue or substance misuse issue.



YOUNG CARERS PROGRAMME

The Young Carers in Schools programme helps secondary schools support young carers and celebrates good practice through the Young Carers in Schools Awards. To achieve our Bronze Award we have demonstrated that we support our young carers in many ways, including:

- Access to a telephone during break and lunch time to phone home if necessary.
- Negotiable deadlines for homework/coursework if required.
- Provision of a Time-Out Card if necessary.
- Parents evening consultations via phone or Teams.
- Access to a Young Carers group to meet other Young Carers - coming soon!
- Opportunities to complete homework at lunchtimes or after-school with a member of staff.
- Opportunities to complete detentions at lunch time.
