BFS Asymptomatic Test Centre has been in full operation this week, carrying out over 300 tests each day to support a safe return to school.

A number of staff have braved the elements this week, welcoming students at the gate and marshalling the queuing system. ## MODEL UNITED NATIONS

Model UN is a popular activity at schools around the world with hundreds of thousands of students worldwide taking part every year at all educational levels. Many of today's leaders in law, government, business and the arts - including at the UN itself - participated in Model UN as students.

BFS restarted its Model United Nations club in the autumn with a group of Y12s and Y13s meeting weekly to discuss complex international issues. Students build skills in group work, debate, empathy and intercultural understanding. The sessions focus on discussing key events, suggesting resolutions, and considering how different countries would respond on an international level. Examples of topics recently debated issues are COP-26, women's reproductive rights and protecting indigenous languages.
