As a first time delegate at MUN, you're not forced to speak, however you are gently reminded to share your country's viewpoint on certain issues which all delegates should research in advance.

He takes us on a journey that exposes the brutality, loneliness and difficulties he has to deal with. Thankfully he has two friends, Eli and Jimmie. Jimmie is a young girl who lives in the town and has her own battle, grieving the loss of her mother. Through her special relationship with Subhi, she is able to feel close to her mother when he reads her diary when because unfortunately, Jimmie is illiterate. Through friendship, respect and their love of stories, these two show the joy felt through moments together even when things around them are falling apart.

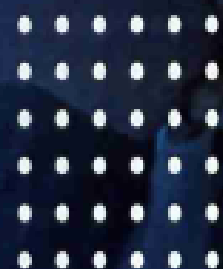

LGBT+ HISTORY MONTH



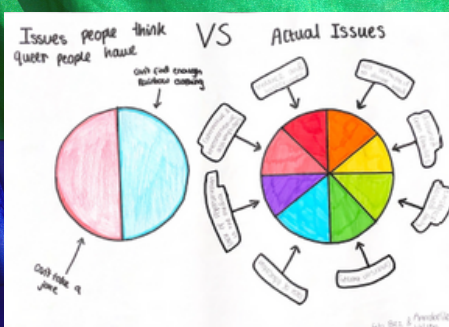

REVISION TIPS

BE REALISTIC

Be realistic about what you can achieve in a day
An unrealistic revision plan won't help you and will put you under unnecessary stress.



TAKE BREAKS

Make sure you take regular breaks from studying. Your brain cannot concentrate for hours at a time.



TIMETABLE

Try breaking it up into chunks and creating a daily timetable so you know what you want to study when. This can make revision feel less overwhelming and much more manageable.



DO WHAT WORKS FOR YOU

Not everyone studies the same way
Some people prefer to read, others find it helpful to make notes or draw diagrams, while others prefer to talk things through. Do what works for you.

FOCUS ON YOU

Focus on you and don't compare yourself to others
It can be really stressful when you think everyone is doing better than you, spending more time on revision than you, or just not stressing out as much as you. But we're all different and that's ok.

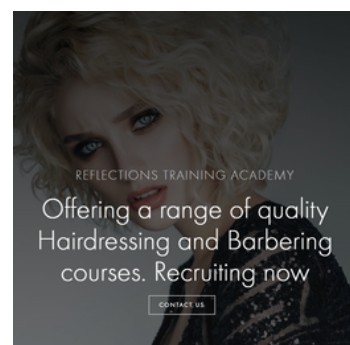

CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH WEEK

It's Children's Mental Health week next week and this year's theme is Growing Together. What better way to highlight all the great things that we do at Bristol Free School for our students' mental health, on our 1st anniversary too!

We support an ever-growing number of students across the whole school with their mental health needs, be it liaising with CAMHS, GPs and therapists to 121 sessions with students when they are struggling. At BFS we are lucky to have some really good professional partnerships which give our students some great opportunities to support their mental health.

The School nurse is in school on a Tuesday, and students can book an appointment through the Mental Health Team.

Our School Counsellor sees students for 6-8 sessions onsite or via online sessions. This is offered on a referral basis via Head of Year and the MH&S team. We have close links with Anna Freud Children & Families Centre and are able to offer an array of support to students and parents/carers with their help. <https://www.annafreud.org/>

Off The Record and Creative Youth Network are regularly working with our young people, both through self and school referrals. <https://www.otrbristol.org.uk/> <https://www.creativeyouthnetwork.org.uk/>

We hold a caseload of approximately 50 students during term time, as well as see students who need a drop in service for when things really are too tough to handle on their own.

There is the tellsomeone@bristolfreeschool.org.uk which gives our students an opportunity to email for help if they don't feel able to hold face to face discussions about what is worrying them.

As always the best way to get in touch if you feel that your young person could do with some support is to contact their Tutor. The Tutors and Heads of Year have a referral system into the Mental Health Team so we can make sure we have the right interventions in place.

There is so much available to our young people that there really is no need to struggle on their own. Please do encourage your children to reach out if they are finding things tough.

We are always on the lookout for additional services, so if you / your child have had some positive experiences with external professional help we are always glad to hear about it.
