LATERAL FLOW HOME TEST KITS

Testing is no longer required so the reminders from TEST REGISTER have now been paused. However you can still submit student results using that platform which is helpful to the school as we are notified of positive cases promptly.

National guidance remains that students may wish to test if they are visiting someone who is at higher risk of getting seriously ill from Covid-19, or that they have tested positive for Covid-19 and want to check whether they are still infectious after day 5. We do have a supply of LFD test kits in school. Whilst we will not be running a mass distribution cycle again, students can pick one up from their tutor or from Student Services. As part of the pastoral support within the school, we have formed a partnership with Avon and Somerset Police to offer parents the chance to attend an information event on Child Sexual Exploitation and Social Media.

The session aims to help parents identify risk factors where a young person might be vulnerable to this and provide them the next steps in accessing support. It will also provide parents with valuable information on different social media apps and how they can be misused.

The session will be delivered by Androulla Nicolaou, Child Exploitation Officer for Avon and Somerset Police's TOPAZ Child Exploitation team.

EUROPEAN YOUTH PARLIAMENT

On Monday 7 March, six Y12 students travelled to Howells School, Cardiff, to a regional session of the European Youth Parliament with Ms Ross and Mrs Meech. Bristol Free School were asked to defend a motion on how to effectively manage the growing number of refugees in Europe and to propose a range of solutions. During the day they also debated, questioned, supported and challenged a range of other motions on diverse topics, such as fast fashion, vaccine roll out and rights of workers in the gig economy.

While the main aim of the day was to debate international issues, working as a team and having fun was also at the heart of the experience. Our team of six spent time preparing to defend their resolution in the Model United Nations Club, as well as in their free time. This included researching, writing speeches and collaborating with the whole team to cover all relevant clauses fully, which included proposing implementation of international treaties on human rights and addressing xenophobia and nationalism.

On the day, our Y12 students gave speeches, asked probing questions and responded to rounds of debate alongside six other schools from South Wales and the South West. It was a long, tiring but exciting day, which showcased the enthusiasm and commitment of our students.

After lunch, the delegates took a break from debates to hear from a key note speaker Heledd Fychan, MS. Heledd shared her experiences in working in student, local and national politics and as an elected member of the Welsh Assembly.

By the end of the day, the students had great success in getting their resolution passed, working effectively as a team and taking some time to enjoy themselves along the way too! EUROPEAN YOUTH PARLIAMENT



An Introduction to Understanding and Supporting Communication

This workshop is an introduction to effective communication strategies. All behaviour is a form of communication and so much of our day to day life centres around it; and this is no different for our children and young people. When we are unable to communicate effectively, it can cause distress, anxiety and behaviours that challenge. This session offers an insight into effective communication and strategies to develop and improve communication with your child.



An Introduction to Understanding and Supporting Anxiety

This workshop provides an insight into anxiety. Everybody experiences anxiety at various times in their lives. For our children, anxiety can be very distressing and can have a deep impact on their lives and ours. During this session we will look at how to recognise triggers for anxiety, why we experience anxiety and provide strategies to help.



An Introduction to Understanding and Supporting Sensory Differences

This workshop provides and introduction to what sensory needs are. Sensory needs are key to many behaviours and often we do not realise the impact that they have on day to day life. This session will provide tips on recognising a sensory need together with practical ways to help your child.



An Introduction to Understanding and Supporting Behaviour

All behaviour is a form of communication. Some behaviours can be really challenging for parents and carers. This can be shown as aggression, frustration or the child who shuts down and 'checks out'. Join us for our introduction to behaviour workshop designed with educational psychologists and parent carers to explore behaviour and behaviour managing strategies.
