### **OUR HEAD STUDENTS**

On Tuesday 24 May, we held our first House Parliament Meeting led by our new head students. Students from across the school came together to (i) discuss the actions that we had taken since our last meeting, (ii) ask the headteacher anything(!) and (iii) establish our new sub-committees to consider ways that the House Parliament could further strengthen our school community.

In our previous meeting, the House Parliament fed back that their favourite things about the school were the quality of teaching, the range of enrichment opportunities on offer and the support for students with mental health challenges. As a result of House Parliament feedback in that meeting, we have worked to establish more residential trip opportunities for 2022-23, planned ways to reduce the cost of BFS uniform, separated out plant-based foods within the canteen, introduced new bins for different types of recycling and begun to plan a Cultural Day which will celebrate the different cultures represented at BFS.

During our 'Ask the Headteacher' session within Tuesday's meeting, the House Parliament students raised a diverse set of topics from the school uniform in summer to making sure that new residential trips were affordable. We then established our new sub-committees and considered how these groups could help strengthen the school. The 'Events and Competitions' sub-committee began to plan a Ukraine fundraiser in Term 6 and thought about ways to develop house competitions. The 'Equality and Diversity' group worked on the Cultural Day for next year and also discussed ways in which they can make the school as inclusive as possible. Our 'Communities and Mental Health' group worked on ways that we can train students to understand how to support their friends with mental health challenges. Finally, the 'Eco School' sub-committee discussed how it could support the school's ongoing desire to reduce waste and become more sustainable; whilst our new 'Curriculum' subcommittee reflected on the Tutor Programme across all year groups.

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

# GYPSY, ROMA & TRAVELLER HISTORY MONTH

EVERY JUNE SINCE 2008, PEOPLE FROM ACROSS THE UK HAVE CELEBRATED GYPSY, ROMA AND TRAVELLER HISTORY MONTH. THROUGH CELEBRATION, EDUCATION AND RAISING AWARENESS, GYPSY, ROMA AND TRAVELLER HISTORY MONTH HELPS TO TACKLE PREJUDICE, CHALLENGE MYTHS AND TO AMPLIFY THE VOICES OF GYPSIES, ROMA AND TRAVELLERS IN WIDER SOCIETY.



#### **'WHAT MAKES A HOME?'**

Gypsies, Roma and Travellers are the largest ethnic minority community in the European Union with over 12 million people across the EU and some 300,000 in the UK. They are very marginalised groups of people that have suffered, and continue to suffer, extreme levels of prejudice. This is an important time to learn about common misconceptions, the richness of Gypsy, Roma and Traveller cultures and how our society can support them better.

There are many different people and groups who fit under the umbrella term 'Gypsies, Roma and Travellers' used in society. This can include Roma people, Romany Gypsies, Irish Travellers, Scottish Gypsy Travellers, New Travellers, Liveaboard Boaters and Travelling Showpeople.





The theme this year, is 'Make Some Space'. The charity 'Friends, Families and Travellers are asking people across the UK to 'Make Some Space' for Gypsy, Roma and Traveller people in their day to day lives. BFS are proud to be supporting this and we have various lessons planned for students to learn and focus on the histories, cultures or present realities of Gypsy, Roma and Traveller people.

Enjoy their poetry and more examples are on bfsmissludwell (Instagram) as well as live readings by the students.

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
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# MENTAL HEALTH & SAFEGUARDING
