ATTENDANCE MATTERS HOLIDAYS

Penalty notices can be issued to parents and carers if they fail to ensure the regular attendance of their child at school. Most commonly they are issued for unauthorised holidays, but they can also be issued for irregular attendance at school. Penalty notice fines are currently £60 per student per parent. So, if two parents take a student on an unauthorised holiday, both parents may receive a £60 fine. Failure to pay a penalty notice may result in a prosecution from the local authority. In cases of poor attendance at school, the local authority may deem prosecution to be a more appropriate measure than a penalty notice. A prosecution can lead to fines of up to £2500 or imprisonment.

Penalty notices and prosecutions are mentioned on attendance letters that we send home to the parents and carers of students with concerning attendance records. This is because the local authority consider it to be best practice to inform parents of the consequences of poor attendance from the earliest point that a concern is raised. As a school, we prefer to work with parents to solve attendance issues at an early stage and only use prosecution as a final resort. If you have any concerns regarding your child's attendance, please contact your child's year leader or the Attendance Team.

Please note, we have been issuing fines.

We have various exciting Art projects happening within the next couple of weeks which require a lot of newspaper. Please send any in you have spare, we will be very grateful!



SIXTH FORM UPDATE

Our Year 12 students will shortly embark on their End of Year exams (and indeed some students have already begun these) and I have been very impressed by the manner in which they have prepared. Students will not be coming into school for tutor or for lessons (apart from in some BTECs) as they practise having many exams in quick succession. These exams will help in the process of providing predicted grades for their UCAS and apprenticeship applications, helping them along the journey to their dream destinations.

The following week (w/c 27 June) will see the majority of our students participating in work experience. Work experience has been optional this year due to the difficulty of finding placement opportunities as a result of the pandemic - but students have secured placements in a broad range of disciplines and locations - from textiles companies in London to architects, primary schools and hospices closer to home. Students who have not secured work experience will remain in school as normal for lesson and tutor - teachers have planned special lessons to support them with re-teach and revision activities connected to the weaker areas that they have identified in recent assessments.

We are also excited to have those Year 11s who plan on joining our Sixth Form with us for the Sixth Form Transition Day on Tuesday 28 June. On this day, students will have an A Level/BTEC lesson in each of the subjects which they have chosen for Sixth Form and will receive a pack of transition work (for each subject) which we would like them to complete in the Summer Holidays in preparation for their first lessons with us in September.

And finally, I must finish with a shout out to our current Year 13s who will be finishing their exam series in the next few weeks. The diligence and resilience with which they have approached their exams have been a real credit to the school and we wish them well with their final few exams (not long now!). We look forward to saying our goodbyes during the Leaver's Assembly (Tuesday 5 July - 10am-11.30am), the Summer Ball (Tuesday 5 July - 7pm-11pm) and the Awards Evening (Monday 18 July - 7pm-11pm).









BFS SCIENCE SUBSEA STEM CHALLENGE!

On Wednesday afternoon we were treated to a tour of Fugro HQ, experiencing how remotely operated vehicles (ROVs) are used to analyse and repair subsea structures, with an additional behind the scenes look at their tooling site. We even got to use some of their very expensive equipment, controlling a titanium mechanical arm and sitting in the driving seat to control the ROVs themselves!


