I CAN AND I AM BUS

Through our membership of Bristol Education Partnership BFS was given the opportunity to welcome the I CAN AND I AM Bus for a week in June.

All our Year 8 students attended a talk from the founder of the charity, I Can and I Am, James Shone. James shared his life experiences of illness, partial recovery and his work now





Following a 16 year teaching career and having been offered a job as Headmaster in 2012, James was diagnosed with a brain tumour. Following 27 hours of brain surgery James unfortunately lost the majority of his sight. However, James is a man who embodies a positive attitude to life and a determination to turn setbacks into springboards. As a teacher, this was at the heart of his pastoral message and his focus now is on spreading the messages of 'I Can & I Am' to as many individuals across the UK and beyond as possible. Put simply, the heart of his charity is to inspire confidence in every individual to enable them to know who they are and what they are able to do, rather than focusing on what they can't.

The I Can & I Am team visit schools around the South West on the bus working with pupils and staff to improve selfesteem and inflate balloons of self-belief. Presentations from James Shone are combined with pizza making and wellbeing workshops on the bus. The messages are rooted in simplicity. Everyone has a balloon of self-belief inside them. When it's full, life tends to be good, we bounce back from setbacks, and we feel like we have purpose. When it's deflated, however, life becomes a struggle, things we may have once found easy become difficult, and it becomes hard to find hope.

THIS WEEK IN DESIGN & TECHNOLOGY

HARRY POTTER STUDIOS!



On Tuesday 28 June Year 10 DT students visited Harry Potter Studios, and what a trip it was!

We explored the two sound stages and backlot where the films were originally made and which are now filled to bursting with original sets, animatronic creatures, and special effects. Students were even able to experience green screen technology themselves and had a go at riding a broomstick. Students were a credit to the school and loved marvelling at how the magic of Harry Potter came to life.



The studios are a highly inspirational place for our Design and Technology students, we saw the entire design process that went into creating the films. From seeing the original designs, the intricate scale models, architectural drawings and videos of the engineers and manufacturers building the sets themselves.

One of highlights for many of our students was Gringotts Bank, showing how the pillars were cast and hand painted to replicate marble, and where the students watched a dragon (albeit not real!) climb through the floor and breathe fire.

The students then went on to view the intricately detailed model of Hogwarts castle. The model's courtyard, tower and turret were filmed and enhanced with digital effects to create unforgettably realistic views of the magical school. Model makers installed more than 2,500 fibre optic lights, which simulate lanterns and torches and even gave the illusion of students passing through the hallways.

Artists also used real gravel for rockwork and boulders, and real plants for landscaping and trees. The work on the model was so extensive that if one was to add all the man hours that have gone into building and reworking the model, it would come to over 74 years.



Not only did this trip link directly with their coursework, but hopefully open their eyes to some of the careers and pathways open to all our students. Students were insightful and full of wonder, asking the staff around the studios loads of questions about how and why the sets were built in the way they were, and what normally happens to them afterwards.

I was incredibly proud of all the students on the trip. I hope they enjoyed it as much as the staff did and we look forward to making this an annual GCSE DT trip!

UNLOCK CYBER TASTER DAY

On Monday 27 June, 23 secondary schools from across the West of England region attended the Unlock Cyber Taster Day event at UWE, Bristol.

Over 300 pupils aged 12 – 14 years took part in 12 different employerled activities. The aim was to help them discover what cyber is all about. Activities included Scalextrics – controlling the leader board and speed of the cars, investigating fake social media accounts, wiretapping - cutting network cables and investigating data, capture the flag challenges, creating and identifying phishing emails, cybercrime scene investigations, encryption exercises and deceiving machines to affect cyber-attacks.

Unlock Cyber is an employer-led initiative working collaboratively to raise awareness and engage with young people to nurture and develop a cyber-talent pipeline. Working together with partners involved in the delivery of Computer Science and Cyber we reach out to secondary schools, academies, and colleges across the West of England.

To celebrate this diversity within the school community we have made hands with how to say hello in each of these languages! Here is how – have a go for yourself:

French = Bonjour (bon-zj-oor) Romanian = Buna ziua (boona zee-wah) Thai = तर्गतर्व (so-wah-dee) Italian = Ciao (ch-ow) Japanese = こんにちは (kon-ni-chi-wa) Kannada = ನಮಸ್ಕಾರ (namaskāra) Gujurati = नमस्ते (namastē) Hindi = नमस्ते (namaste)



Portuguese = Olá (oh-la) Lithuanian = Labas (la-bas) Russian = привет (pree-vee-et) Turkish = Merhaba (mehr-ha-bah) Twi = Agoo (ah-goo) Vietnamese = xin chào (sin chow) Bulgarian = Zdrasti (dras-tee) Ukrainian = привіт (preh-veet)
