GENERATION JUICE

Generation Juice will be demonstrating and launching the new self-service Drinkshub machines in the canteen at lunchtime on Wednesday 19 October.

There are a range of flavoured juices to choose from costing 80p for large (500ml) and 50p for small (250ml) and you can simply pay with finger scan or buy as part of a meal deal.

This will replace the sale of drinks in single-use plastic bottles as part of our strategy to reduce plastics in school and reduce our carbon footprint.

Water is freely available from the water bottle fillers in the canteen and sports hall.



In readiness for this, students will be given BFS branded drinks bottles in tutor time on Tuesday, as part of our 10-year anniversary celebrations. Students should put their name on it, as they will all look the same, and keep safe in bags.

FIRST HOUSE PARLIAMENT MEETING

Today, we held our first 'House Parliament' meeting of the year. The newly elected representatives, selected by the Head Students after an assessment of their anonymised applications, assembled for an opening Q&A with Mrs King and a discussion on classroom and corridor behaviour with Mr MacBlain. Students asked about the type of trips that are being organised this year and about the development of land close to the school and gave their suggestions to help the flow of movement in the corridor between lessons.

Last year, the House Parliament worked successfully on a number of initiatives; including reducing plastic in the canteen (we are about to provide everyone with a reusable BFS water bottle and have installed self-service juice machines in response), increasing the breadth of enrichment and trips on offer (we wrote home with an extended list of planned trips in response) and about canteeen queues (we opened a new outside serving hatch in response).

This year, the Parliament will again work in different committees to work on more ways to continually improve our school (more to follow through the year).

At our next meeting, we'll be joined by the company which runs our catering to discuss students' feedback.










CONGRATULATIONS ARTHUR!

Year 8 have been looking at experimental drawing skills and bugs. Tonal drawing, blind drawing, left-handed drawing, continual line and drawing from memory.








