

HATTIE, Y8

Back when I was in Year 5, I got invited to go on a trip to visit the Kamurasi school, which is in a town called Masindi in Uganda. One of my primary teachers, Mrs Edwards, runs a charity called Children of Masindi that supports the Kamurasi school. One special thing about the school is that it accommodates disabled children, they have a lot of children with special needs including children that are deaf, blind or disabled in other ways.

Mrs Edwards had an idea to take students from the school to visit the Budongo Rainforest, which is about 100 km away from the school. She wanted them to have the opportunity to experience the rainforest, and to learn about its importance.

My primary school (Horfield) got involved by raising money to support the trip, and they adopted the forest as their whole school theme for the year. This included composing a forest song and sending it over to the Kamurasi school. I got invited to go to Masindi with Mrs Edwards and join the trip to the rainforest. We were meant to go in May 2020 but after being pushed back due to the pandemic we finally got to go this half-term, two and a half years late!



It was definitely worth the wait though! It was an amazing experience! Uganda is an incredible country, very different to the UK! The weather was mostly very hot but there was also torrential rain and some massive thunderstorms. It felt really safe, and everyone we met was so friendly! The roads were a bit mad – with lots of motorbike taxis (called Boda Bodas), carrying several people, animals and even furniture! The Kamurasi school is very different to BFS but was amazing to look around, and the children and staff were so kind and welcoming! Over two days, we took around 140 of the children to the Budongo Rainforest. Most of them had never been there before. The rainforest was incredible, we saw several different types of monkeys but unfortunately didn't manage to see the chimpanzees that live there. It was amazing to go there with the children from Kamurasi, everyone really enjoyed it. Before we came home, we were also lucky enough to go on safari to the Murchison Falls National Park. We saw loads of wildlife, including hippos, giraffes, elephants, lions, buffalo, a leopard and an enormous crocodile. A trip to a rhino sanctuary meant that we saw all of the big five!

It was an incredible experience that I will never forget, and I plan to keep on raising money to support the Kamurasi School.

UK BEBRAS COMPUTATIONAL THINKING CHALLENGE 2021

Students from all around the world participated in The Bebras Competition this year. More than 87000 students participated in Junior category, 155000 in Inter category, 29000 and 10000 students participated in seniors and elite category respectively in the UK. More than 650 students participated from BFS in The Bebras competition this year. 71 students are top 10% in the UK, all 71 students will be awarded Gold certificates and will participate in next round of Bebras competition known as The Oxford University Computing Challenge in February 2023. Congratulations to all Gold winners. In junior category 54 students achieved distinction, In Inters 97 students achieved distinction and in seniors and elite 25 students achieved distinction.

MS URCH'S WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP TRIP TO

ABU DHABI

Last weekend my best friend and I travelled to Abu Dhabi in the Middle East to compete in the 2022 World Triathlon Championships, representing Great Britain in our age group team. I had to prequalify for the event back in 2021 at a British qualifier in Bournemouth. Leaving the UK late Wednesday night and arriving at Abu Dhabi on Thursday morning was a shock to the system, arriving in 30 degree heat. My bike arrived in one piece, which is always a bonus! I had two days to acclimatise and soak up the atmosphere. There were teams from all over the world from Australia, USA, Canada, through to many European and Middle Eastern and South American teams such as Saudi Arabia, UAE, Brazil and Chile. The event itself was a Standard Olympic distance of a 1.2k swim, 40k bike and 10k run. The water temperature was a very warm 28 degrees, so wetsuits were not legal. The race started well for me and I came out of the water in 4th place. The bike was super tough, and I fell down the field by some way. However as soon as I got off the bike, I made up some places and came 10th in the run leaving me in 21st position overall, with my best friend pipping me at 19th. Overall, the experience was incredible and one I will never forget. I have only been competing in triathlon for four seasons, so I want to say to each and every one of you that anything really is possible with hard work, dedication, belief in yourself and support from those closest to you. Now for the off season, lots of mince pies and a well-deserved rest!
