#### **INDUSTRIAL** ACTION

I have received several questions about the Industrial Action next Wednesday, so I am outlining the plan for Wednesday 1 February.

·Subject teachers who are not striking will be scheduling their lessons for the day between 8.30 and 8.55am.

·Students will not have tutor time that day so will need to check Microsoft Teams at 9.00am to see which lessons they will attend. It is likely that this will vary from student to student and depends on their subject teachers.

·Students should join the lessons that appear on Teams by clicking on the link. We ask that students keep their cameras off and use the mic and chat when asked to do so from the teacher. Registers will be taken at the start of every lesson that is scheduled.

·Teachers will follow the behaviour policy used in school. Rewards will be given for good attitude and good progress as house points. One formal warning will be given if a student is not meeting expectations and they will be removed from the live lesson if the poor behaviour continues.

·When a teacher is absent due to the strike, students can work independently or have free time.

·Year 11 are expected to use the day wisely by completing NEA work or revision tasks that have been set via Teams/Class Charts. Year 10 can revise for their Religion and Philosophy short course GCSE mock examination which is on 27 February.

·Year 13 will have revision tasks in preparation for mock 2.

·We are not able to cover lessons for striking teachers. We will not know who is striking until 8.25am on Wednesday 1 February.

I hope you find this guidance helpful, and this is a productive day despite the obvious disruption.





Everyone spent the next hour looking around the many exhibits, learning how Bristol has been such an important city in the history of transportation and aviation, as well as workers and civil rights.

After lunch, we had our tour of Concorde with the staff filling us in on all the history and facts. Everyone was fascinated by the speed and design of the plane!

We were just in time to have a peek around the conservation workshop, where the amazing volunteers have been working on the repair and reconstruction of WW2 and Vietnam war era aircraft, including some that were recovered from people's back gardens. They were incredible!


#### CYBER CAREERS EVENT AT UWE

As we hurtle towards Children's Mental Health Week, we are encouraging our young people to keep themselves mentally healthy. We deliver support and guidance to each of our year groups in school, in various different ways.

#### **Y7 MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAMME**



The Year 7 students have now completed their mental health programme, giving them lots of ways to self-assess and self-regulate. If they haven't spoken to you about it, please do ask them to show you some square breathing or EFT (tapping technique).

#### PEER TO PEER MENTORING

Year 8, 11, 12 & 13 have peer to peer mentoring running for a number of students that have been identified as benefiting from some student support. This type of mentoring is great as it gives young people a chance to connect with the older students, having had the lived experiences recently. It is also great for our mentors to gain experience of this type – great for the UCAS personal statements!



Mental health assemblies, open door drop ins and tutor messages are available to those facing exams season again. Next on our list are Year 9 & 10 looking at relationship building, communication and resilience programmes.
