



KEY STAGE 3



TEXTILE DESIGN & MANUFACTURE

YEAR 7

In Year 7, students have been carefully creating their soft sculptures. They have been learning to hand-sew with various stitches, applique and use the sewing machine. The class have used the work of Claus Oldenburg and the Pop Art movement for inspiration.





YEAR 8

In Year 8, students have been experimenting with different textile finishing techniques. They have used Batik, screen printing and tie dye. They are going to make a patchwork tote bag using their own design pieces and upcycled fabric. We are always on the look out for more fabric so if you have to donate, please let a D&T teacher know.



GRAPHIC DESIGN

In Year 8, students have looked at different techniques used by graphic designers to convey messages through visual imagery. They were tasked with creating a mood board of images that represented themselves using their colour theory and knowledge of typography. They used these images to create a 'logo' that was personal to them. We scanned their drawings and used the sublimation printer and heat press (bought by FoBFS – Thank you!) to print onto coasters. There have been some amazing and professional outcomes.








CAM & CAD ENGINEERING

Students have been enjoying learning to use TinkerCAD, a free CAD programme that connects with our 3D printer. Students were given the brief to design a Lunar Lander to conduct scientific experiments. The winning designs are being 3D printed – watch this space to see their final outcome!





CREATIVE MEDIA





Our creative media project allows students to use a variety of photographic and graphic software. They use their Microsoft suite to store, edit and email their designs. Year 7 have been looking at creative ways to photograph bottles and different photographic tools they can use. They uploaded their images onto Photoshop where they manipulated them. Students are in the final stages of the project and are beginning to plan their final photoshoot inspired by the photographer Slinkachu.



GCSE classes have been consolidating their knowledge about manufacturing a small product in each material using different

They have also been learning how to professionally portion a chicken. Students have to learn 20 key food preparation skills and portioning a chicken is one of the top skills. Some students opt to demonstrate in Year 11 to achieve top grades. Well done Year 10 - a great start to your GCSE!

MRS KINNERSLEY

I have been teaching for around 15 years. I have enjoyed seeing students grow in confidence and find pride in the work they can produce. My favourite bit is hearing from students who have gone on to study Art or Photography at University and progressed further in the creative industries. Helping young people find their creative voice is what makes teaching so worthwhile!



My favourite thing about teaching is working with young people. Watching them progress academically and grow in confidence and into young adults is rewarding and uplifting. Teaching gives me a sense of purpose unlike other jobs I have had previously, and I feel especially supported and part of a caring, important community at Bristol Free School.

MISS TOVEY

I love the feeling of watching my students understand really tricky concepts - those lightbulb moments are fantastic! I have recently taught Y13 about synaptic transmission in the nervous system, introducing highly scientific terminology; hearing them explain the process to one another with confidence and accuracy reminded me what a pleasure it is to work with such amazing young people.

Thursday 5 October was World Teachers' Day, and this year's theme focused on reversing the teacher shortage. We spoke to a few of our teaching staff to find out what their favourite things about teaching are!

MR HARRIS

Teaching, especially English, is an absolute privilege and I feel so fortunate be involved with young people at this vital stage in their lives. I teach English because I believe that the study of literature is the study of what it means to be human, and along the way we help the students decide who they really are and what they want to be. Of course, there is no better feeling than watching them go on to their next steps - seven years later - as capable human beings who have achieved more highly than they ever thought would be possible. We have the opportunity and the responsibility to open doors both to - and within - our students. English can be the key to countless new discoveries, skills and perspectives. However, day-to-day, the best thing about teaching is the spontaneity, energy and humour of our students. Every lesson, every day is different; I know it sounds cliché but I learn a lot from the students too. But most of all, it can be great fun!

MRS HUMPHRIES

As a music teacher, it is wonderful when pupils take time out of their day to show me a piece of music they have been practising. I really enjoy spending those couple of minutes listening and appreciating their music-making. It is also great hearing students rehearse at lunch and after school in bands they have formed themselves.

Another part of my teaching role, which I thoroughly enjoy, is being a tutor, as you become the teacher they see every day who can send them off to lessons each morning with a smile and a positive word. I would recommend being a teacher, as it is incredibly rewarding seeing pupils develop their skills, and no day is ever dull!
