In 2016, she became the world's first professional female rugby union referee. On 25 September 2021, she became the first woman to referee a (men's) Premiership Rugby Union Match between Harlequins and Worcester Warriors.

Mary Earps uses her platform to promote gender equality in sports. She openly advocates for better recognition, respect, and pay for female athletes. This sends a powerful message about equality and respect for women not just in sports, but also in other facets of life.

Baroness Brenda Hale

First woman to serve as President of the UK Supreme Court. Lady Hale argued that the judiciary needed to become more diverse so that the public have greater confidence in judges. Hale called for a more balanced gender representation on the UK's highest court and swifter progress promoting those from minority ethnic backgrounds and with "less privileged lives".

Gina Martin

Is an activist, author and law changer, who campaigned as a victim of sexual harassment to create the Voyeurism Act in 2019. She is an ambassador for UN Women and has campaigned for causes including period poverty, censorship bias on Instagram, gender equality and now works as a facilitator for workshops on gender, misogyny and its impact on young people.



Lindsey Hilsum

A brave journalist who reports from some of the most dangerous conflicts around the world. She always interviews the innocent people impacted by conflict and tells their story with compassion. The fact she is 65 years old is also very inspiring.

EMPLOYER TALKS

Today we welcomed Andy Howse to talk to a packed room of students from Year 9 - 13 about careers in professional sport.

Andy is a physiotherapist and is currently working with the Basketball England squads; he previously worked at Gloucester Rugby for three seasons and has also worked in artistic swimming.

He has been to the Commonwealth Games twice (2018 & 2022) and been part of the team that has won two silver and one gold medal at the games. Andy talked about how he started his career in physiotherapy and how he got into professional sport. He talked about the range of professionals that work in professional sport and their roles, these included: sports psychologists, nutritionists, strength and conditioning coaches, welfare officers, sports analysts and media officers. He busted the myth that you need to be interested in science and medicine to work in elite sport and provided information on the variety of routes into such roles.

Andy spent time after the session answering questions from students who were eager to hear more about what they can be doing now to help their chances of getting into a competitive field. Thank you very much to Andy for giving up his time and to all of the students who attended. Students who attended will be able to access Andy's slides on their Unifrog account.

Today Year 13 have had their final pastoral day with us at BFS. The theme of the day was to prepare students for making their next steps. Miss Evans kindly volunteered to run cooking sessions throughout the day so that all students had the opportunity to learn how to cook some basic and budget-friendly meals which will certainly be helpful for those moving away this September!



BFS staff also ran sessions which focussed on student finance and banking, top tips for preparing for university/apprenticeships and preparing for writing academically. Students also had the opportunity to practise CPR using our CPR training kits - a life-saving skill that is important for everyone to know about.



We also had a visiting speaker from the Hollie Gazzard Trust who talked to students about coercive controlling relationships. Sara talked about how to identify them and what to do if you find yourself in one. This was a really powerful and hard-hitting session but a hugely worthwhile one for our young people.

Thank you to our Year 13 students who were enthusiastic throughout the day and to all the staff involved, particularly Ms Evans who gave up a lot of her time.

YEAR 9 STEM CHALLENGE DAY

Last Friday, some of our amazing Year 9 students took part in a fun day of STEM activities, provided by Lynne from the Smallpeice Trust.

In the morning, we learned what it means to be an engineer and how engineering is integral to everything we use in life. Building towers with only paper meant that groups had to use team work and communication skills as well as their knowledge of construction and material strength. The winning tower was measured at 1.7M and saw the girls teams triumph! Then, beginning to use our design skills, we were tasked to choose materials and budget their use to form three straw gliders. With varying success, eventually we all hit the target!

The afternoon was spent on the main part of the STEM challenge, designing, making and flying motorised aircraft! Each team split into roles including marketing, finance, engineer and manager and everyone excelled in their field! Huge variations in design were tested on the outdoor runway, with some planes making a distance of over four metres. To round out the experience, each team had to present and sell their concept to the audience, with some groups taking inspiration from famous entrepreneurs and speakers.

A huge well done to all students involved and a special congratulations to our winning team - Ryan, Luke, Henry, Freddie and Austin!



BFS ART COMPETITION






Champions of Equality


Discover the stories of women who courageously fought against prejudice and injustice, both well-known activists and more overlooked drivers of change.



